



## Denton Boys Baseball Inc. Coach's Code of Conduct

Coaches shall remain unconditionally supportive of DBBI's commitment to the ideals of good sportsmanship, team play, and respect for authority. In addition, coaches shall remain sensitive to the physical and emotional well-being of the players on his/her team.

Each coach shall agree to the following standards:

- Coaches will be positive role models.
- Coaches will be responsible for the conduct of their players and parents.
- Coaches will display and instill in their players the principles of good sportsmanship and team play.
- Coaches will conduct themselves in a manner best serving the interest of all players - not just your own.
- Coaches will do their best to provide all players (not just your own) with a positive experience.
- Coaches will treat all players, parents, spectators, and league officials with respect.
- Coaches will provide instruction in a manner that is constructive and supportive.
- Coaches will not ridicule players, umpires, or league officials.
- Coaches' behavior demonstrating an endangerment to a player's self-esteem/self-worth, the health or mental/emotional well-being of any child by ANY manner will not be tolerated.
- Coaches will comply with the decisions of league officials and observe all rules, policy and procedures as established by DBBI.
- Coaches will teach the game of baseball to the best of their ability.
- Coaches will be drug and alcohol free while at any DBBI event.
- Coaches will not use any tobacco products or E-cigarettes in the dugout or on the playing field.
- Coaches agree to follow guidelines set by DBBI for practice schedules, batting cage usage and light codes.
- Coaches agree to attend any skill sessions or coach clinics may be offered by DBBI.
- Coaches will read, understand, and follow the directives indicated in the DBBI Policies on Sports Abuse Prevention training document.
- Coaches agree to a background check.

Consequences for Coach Ejections:

- The first ejection results in an automatic one game suspension. This includes the current game plus the next game. Any coach ejected from a game must submit a written report to DBBI within 48 hours of the incident. Failure to submit a written report within the allotted time will result in additional penalties. DBBI reserves the right to increase the suspension if the offense is of a serious nature.
- If a coach is ejected for a second time in one season, the incident will be reviewed by the DBBI Board of Directors and the coach is subject to a possible suspension for the remainder of the season.
- Note: The location of the ejection does not matter. These consequences apply for home or away games.

I have read and understand the DBBI Coach's Code of Conduct including the DBBI Policies on Sports Abuse Prevention documented within my online registration and agree to abide by the provisions. I understand that failure to comply with any of the above points can result in suspension and/or expulsion as determined by the DBBI Board of Directors.
